

Caring for your dog's Urinary Health



Simple adjustments to your pet's living environment and daily routines can significantly contribute to their comfort and support their urinary health.

Is your dog...

How to help:

Experiencing discomfort urinating?

Urinary stones can block the flow of urine and irritate the urinary lining, which can lead to discomfort and pain during urination.



Nutritionally support urinary issues

Specialised diets can be recommended to manage urinary stones and help avoid their recurrence.

Drinking enough water?

Promoting higher water intake can help dilute urine, preventing crystal formation and flushing stone minerals.



Encourage water intake

Make sure that fresh water is always available. This means refilling your dog's water bowl multiple times a day and using portable bottles during walks.

Urinating more often?

Dogs with urinary stones may urinate more often than usual. This increased frequency is often due to irritation and discomfort caused by the stones in the urinary tract.



Increase the frequency of walks

Instead of increasing the length of your dog's walks, consider taking shorter, more frequent walks. This can help your dog relieve themselves without overexertion.

Nervous or agitated?

Dogs with urinary stones often experience discomfort and pain, which can lead to changes in their behaviour and mood.



Reduce stress & encourage playtime

Create a comfortable and quiet resting area for your dog. Give affection when they appear agitated, to help create a calming environment for your dog.
