




How to help:

Experiencing discomfort urinating?

Urinary stones can block the flow of urine and irritate the urinary lining, which can lead to discomfort and pain during urination.



Manage urinary pH with diet

Specialised diets such as PRO PLAN[®] VETERINARY DIETS UR Urinary range can help dissolve urinary stones, such as struvite uroliths.

Drinking enough water?

Promoting higher liquid intake can help dilute urine, to help reduce crystal formation and flushing stone minerals.



Encourage water intake

Use accessible water stations, wide bowls, and fountains for fussy drinkers. Products like PRO PLAN[®] Hydra CareTM and wet/mixed diets can also help promote water intake.

Urinating more often?

Urinary issues can include conditions such as urinary tract infections, urinary stones, or feline idiopathic cystitis (FIC), which can lead to increased frequency of urination and urination outside the litter box.



Keep litter boxes clean

Maintain a clean, accessible litter box in quiet areas to help keep your cat comfortable and prevent a dirty environment stopping your cat from urinating.

Nervous or agitated?

Stress is considered a significant factor in the development and exacerbation of urinary issues, particularly with Feline Idiopathic Cystitis (FIC), which can lead to restlessness and agitation.



Reduce stress & encourage playtime

Establish cosy resting spots, separate feeding areas and litter boxes, avoid sudden changes in routines, offer gentle attention, hiding places, and playtime with toys.
